



World Genius Search Examination Global Genius Awards – 2021 Application Procedure for Schools

1. Introduction

World Genius Search Examination (WGSE) is the well-accepted global platform for focused observations, precise assessment, caliber measurement and right decision making. WGSE is currently open to Grade / Class 1 to 12. It will get extended to post graduate level from 2023.

2. Global Genius Awards 2021

WGSE is the Global Benchmark Test which explores the ability of a student to derive good logic and apply Mathematics and Science for right decision-making. All the **100 percentile scorers** of WGSE 2021 from each Grade / Class will be conferred with **Global Genius Awards 2021**.

3. The WGSE Scores: GPS & GII

Apart from Global Genius Awards, WGSE offers two scores.

a. Global Percentile Score™ (GPS)

Global Percentile Score (GPS) is the Grade / Class wise score offered globally every year. Though GPS is the primary score confined to the respective years, the second score is more precious than GPS due to its wider applications and analysis.

b. Global Intellectual Index™ (GII)

Global Intellectual Index is the most sought-after caliber measurement score derived from all the WGSE participating years. It has detailed analysis too. GII is offered on a scale of 0 to 9. Consistent WGSE participation ensures more reliable and precise GII as it is calculated using all the scores from the base (first) year to current year.

c. GII: Scope & Applications

As GII is a derived score from all the WGSE scores, it can be effectively used for a various applications including campus recruitments, proficiency assessment, educational loans, admissions to various Universities, International Recognition & Scholarships. It acts as the Credible Caliber Index in Academics and Career. WGSE will be extended to Graduate and Post Graduate Courses from 2022.

To get more clarity on GII, Consider this example. When a student participates in WGSE from Grade / Class 1 and appears for WGSE at the final year of Graduation, the GII Score can be 15 Y – 8.12345. Here, 15 Y indicates the number of participating years without any break and 8.12345 indicates the precise caliber score drawn from the Global Percentile Scores (GPS) of all those 15 years.

4. WGSE 2021: Online & Offline

Considering the prevailing pandemic condition across the world, we have decided to introduce online and offline mode for WGSE – 2021 for the convenience of Schools and Students.

In the online mode, schools can schedule WGSE (Grade / Class wise) and students can take it online either from school or home using a smartphone or laptop.

Although students can opt for online mode, we recommend offline mode. When schools or students use the offline mode, school should schedule the Grade / Class wise timings and students should come to the school to take WGSE at the scheduled time. Due to the prevailing situation, the test can be held spread over two days, depends on the convenient time of the School. Please ensure that the timings meant for a Grade / Class will be the same but another Grade / Class may have different timings in order to maintain safe distancing.

5. Key Dates

The following are the key dates for WGSE – 2021.

Closing Date for WGSE 2021 Registrations: **Friday, 30 April, 2021**

Please mail us if you need further extension.

Test Dates: School has to choose any two dates for Grade / Class 1 to 4 and for 5 to 12. These dates should be between 21st June 2021 and 15th July 2021 as Board exams are extended till June 2021.

6. How to administer the WGSE:

A school can administer WGSE 2021 in two modes – Online & Offline

a. WGSE Online Mode

The School should opt for two convenient dates (between 21st June 2021 and 15th July 2021) and time to conduct WGSE for their students. One date for Grade / Class 1 to 4 and another date for Class 5 to 12. The school can opt for different timings for each Grade / Class or it can be done simultaneously.

Students can take the test from the school or from their home at the scheduled time. A smartphone or a PC / laptop with Mic and Camera can be used.

If the situation demands, Students of Class 8 to 12 should take a second level test since we have not included the subjective question in the first level like last year. The Board will decide about the second level after the evaluation of the first level.

b. WGSE Offline Mode

As schools are aware, the offline mode will be conducted like last year (the conventional paper and pen mode) using OMR Answer Sheets. The test can be conducted at the scheduled time opted by the school but it should be held for each Grade / Class at the same time.

Schools can opt for a single date or two dates like the online mode, depends on the number of participating students.

7. Fee Structure, Exemptions & CARTEST

a. The following is the fee structure (except Grade / Class 1) for WGSE 2021.

b. Exemptions from the Fee payment

- i.** Schools are allowed to register all the Grade / Class 1 students for WGSE by paying Rs. 20 (Twenty) in India and USD 1 outside India.
- ii.** All those who pay and register for WGSE 2021 from Grade / Class 9 and 10 can write Career Aptitude & Recognition Test (CARTEST) and get an Extensive Report. No fee will be charged from them, though the actual fee is Rs. 1200 in India and USD 20 or Rs. 1500 outside India. Online CARTEST will be available to them in the month of July 2021 with instant results.

9. Fee Collection and Registrations by Schools

STEP – I : Collect the Registration Fee from students:

Collect the fee from the students as it is indicated under point Number 7

OR

We can give you online fee payment link which you can circulate among students. They can pay the fee online and it will come directly to us with your school code. After 30th April, we can send you the student list and the corresponding administrative expenses.

In this case you need not follow further steps of Point No. 10 & 11.

STEP –II: Remit the Fee

Complete the School Participation List (in the excel format) and Consent Form (SPL) with students' details. Out of the fee collected, the school should retain the test administration expenses for the school as mentioned in Point No. 7. Remit the balance fee to the account of the WGSE administrator – **World Genius Conclave Private Limited**.

The fee can be paid to the WGSE administrator's account in the following ways:

1. Deposit cash in the account of WGSE administering agency at any of the State Bank of India branches across India. Account details are given below.
2. Use NEFT / RTGS / SWIFT/ Net banking to transfer the fee to the WGSE administering agency
3. By sending a Demand Draft / Multicity Cheque, favouring **World Genius Conclave Private Limited**, payable at par across India. (We do not prefer DD since it may delay issuing the receipts.)

If the fee is paid by DD, make it payable at par across India.

STEP –III: Forward SPL & Fee

Schools may send soft format of the completed SPL, with Fee payment details to worldgeniuscouncil@gmail.com with a copy to wgse@worldgenius.global As we receive the details of deposit / transfer, we shall send you the receipt of payment, the WGC School Code and WGC Student IDs by email.

Send the completed SPL along with the Demand Draft / Proof of Fee payment to the address given alongside.

Kindly mention your school name, WGC School Code (if allotted already; or else send us a mail for new code) contact number and full school address with postal code on the overleaf of the draft.

10. Checklist

- a.** Duly filled-in and correctly named School Participation List (SPL - 2021) in Excel format through email.
- b.** Scanned copy of (a) Cash Deposit slip or (b) RTGS / NEFT / SWIFT Reference ID (UTR No.) or (c) Demand Draft.
- c.** In case of Demand Draft, a Photocopy of the same is also to be enclosed, stapled to the School Participation List.
- d.** Keep a copy of the documents before you send it.

11. WGC School ID

A comprehensive revamp is done on WGC School ID to accommodate various global parameters and to make it scalable. Now it is 8 digit numbers beginning with ISO UN M49 Numerical Code. For example, the code for India is 356. Indian schools will have their IDs starting with 35600001, 35600002 so on. We have already mailed you the new ID. If you do not know your New School ID, please write to us – response@worldgenius.global

12. WGC Student ID

Schools can allot WGC Student IDs to student using their New School ID. The new 8 digit School ID followed by 7 digits starting from 0000001. Hence, the school with School ID 35600001 can allot 356000010000001, 356000010000002 Please note that all existing STUDENT IDs will be replaced by us using the same criteria and we will inform this to schools.

To make it easier, in India, students can go for voluntary use of their 12 digit Aadhaar Number prefixed with the Indian code 356 to make it 15 digits. Please note that we use the number only. No proof or verification required. This is to ensure that the student can remember the ID easily. Otherwise, schools can use the same criteria as given in the paragraph above.

VERY IMPORTANT NOTE:

- 1.** Kindly ensure that all students who appeared for WGSE 2020 (last year) are appearing this year too, to keep the validity of their GII score which is derived from all their WGSE Scores. Any break in continuous participation will lapse the validity of their GII score. Please refer Point No. 3.b & c.
- 2.** Please ensure that the WGC Student ID of the earlier students (last year) will remain the same and use it to fill the excel format of SPL to draw earlier score to calculate new GII.

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
